- 1 Please put your rubbish in Ginan Town designated bags before putting them at rubbish collection stations.
- Rubbish in non-designated bags will not be collected.
- Designated bags are sold at supermarkets, convenience stores, etc.
- 2 Please put out burnable rubbish between 7AM and 8AM on the day of collection.
- 3 Rubbish will be collected on national holidays, but not from January 1st to 3th.

The town hall also collects small household electronic devices (mobile phones, digital cameras, and handheld gaming consoles).

Items collected at the Eco Station

Bottles, steel cans, aluminium cans, PET bottles, scrap paper, paper containers and packaging, plastic containers and packaging, Styrofoam, white Styrofoam trays, newspapers, cardboard, magazines, milk cartons, clothes, fluorescent lights, batteries, used cooking oil, PET bottle caps, mobile phones, digital cameras, handheld video game consoles (please see the Household Rubbish Sorting Chart for details of how to dispose of these items).

Glass Bottles

●Put out in groups of clear, colorless bottles, brown bottles, and other colored bottles.

%Always remove caps and wash inside bottles before putting them out.

Cans

•Put out in groups of steel cans, aluminum cans, and spray cans. **%**Put out spray

cans and gas cylinders after finishing them completely. (Do not open a hole)

PET Bottles

Remove caps and labels before putting out PET bottles.

Wash inside and crush bottles before putting them out.

Trays/Styrofoam

Only white food trays and Styrofoam are collected.

●Remove all plastic wrap or cellotape and wash items before putting them out.

Plastic Containers/ Packaging

For containers with pumps, remove the pump before putting the containers out. (Pumps are burnable rubbish.)

Remove contents and clean dirty items before putting them out. <Examples> Paper boxes for candy, snacks, etc., paper wrapping, mounting paper,

Non-Collectable Rubbish Hazardous Rubbish (Compressed gas canisters, waste oil, farming chemicals, fire extinguishers, cell batteries, etc.) Please return the following items to the point of purchase to dispose of them: tyres, oil, paint, LPG canisters, fire extinguishers, motorbikes, poison, agricultural waste, batteries $\,lepha$ Natural materials such as stones and earth cannot be collected.

Commercial Rubbish Disposal Business operators are responsible for appropriately disposing of any rubbish from their places of business, commercial stores, restaurants etc. in accordance with the law. Any commercial waste or general rubbish from businesses must be taken directly to a waste disposal plant (with a permit from the town hall), or be disposed of by Ginan Town's licensed waste disposal operator (Takashima Eisei). (Business operators are responsible for fees incurred by sorting and transportation.)
